(Côtes du Roussillon)



The home to this full-bodied red wine is a region both stark and majestic, with the snowcapped peaks of the French Pyrenees shining in the distance. There is a whiff of the *garrigue* (the wild-herb-covered hills) in the bouquet. In the mouth, it's dry and sturdy — superb with grilled food and cheeses, game and hearty stews. Drink a bottle, with food like this, and good friends to share it! Santé.
