OVERAGED MALT WHISKY



Michel Couvreur is a rare bird indeed. A Belgian wine-merchant specializing in Burgundy, he fell in love with Scotch whisky in the 1950s, and made it his life's work. Today he ages the spirit in his cellars in Burgundy, using the hand-picked sherry butts that he considers the secret to truly great Scotch. Recently he lost the right to use the name Scotch, as it is bottled in France, but the whisky remains unparalleled: a nose full of dried flowers, and a powerful palate of sherry, tobacco and dried fruits.

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
